UCSF Office of Research Summary document: research density and requirements for quarantining and/or testing for research personnel December 29, 2020

UCSF strongly recommends against traveling and gathering over the holidays. The UCSF research communities must comply with the public health emergency order imposing a <u>mandatory 10-day quarantine</u> for anyone traveling, moving or returning to San Francisco from anywhere outside the nine-county Bay Area.

Every effort should be made to work remotely and limit onsite work to essential activities that cannot be accomplished from home.

This document summarizes the research density applying to UCSF research activities (effective Dec. 24, 2020), and requirements for quarantining and/or testing under the <u>UCSF quarantine order and travel policy</u> currently in place until Jan. 19, 2021 (may be extended as needed). It is designed to provide quick guidance for different categories of research and personnel and does not replace the full guidelines and policies implemented by UCSF and the Office of Research.
